As part of the North Vancouver School District community, we will be working with all our colleagues to provide the supports needed by students and their families as they also deal with this trauma. As public school teachers, we know strong public schools are key to healthy communities; in challenging times such as these, our collective strength and focus on student well-being provides the strong foundation that our community needs.

Our local events also take place during a time of broader social struggles and specifically the recent shootings in Atlanta which highlight a broader issue impacting our members and community with the rise of anti-Asian racism during the pandemic. We all have a role to play in addressing anti-Asian racism, acknowledging its history in Canada specifically and taking action to change society. We must all continue this work together.

Finally, on a positive note, Dr. Henry's Monday announcement has made masks mandatory in all schools for staff and students in Grade 4 and up, with recommended mask wearing for students in Kindergarten to Grade 3. Although it has taken a long time and an enormous amount of energy on behalf of teachers, parents and other community members, this change will provide everyone with an added layer of protection.

BCTF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING UPDATE

Thank you to the following NVTA members who, along with our Local Representatives, Tammy Daley, Owen Howell, and Katrina Russell volunteered to serve as NVTA delegates to the BCTF AGM held virtually over Spring Break: A. Bennett Fox, K. Gill, J. Kwong, C. Pena, E. Robinson, M. Thomson, and A. Turcato. The virtual nature of such a large meeting added an additional burden on those teachers who attended, so we would like to extend an additional thanks.

The BCTF member fees have been set at 1.69% of the actual salary of the member for contract teachers and 1.59% for Teachers Teaching on Call. There was much healthy debate on the matter, but the ultimate decision was to maintain the status quo. The fee for the Salary Indemnity Fund (SIP) was set at 1.91% of actual salary. This is a reduction from the current school year.

The current Table officers were acclaimed to their same positions for next school year: President Teri Mooring, 1st Vice President Clint Johnston, and 2nd Vice President Carol Gordon.
