Not only do you make a positive impact on the individuals that teach, but you help to strengthen and shape our society. Thank you for everything that you do.

Looking forward to next school year, we will have to work to manage the anticipated challenges of implementing the new reporting order. The NVTA will be advocating for supports, in-service training, and managing the expectations of administrators and parents so that teachers are not unreasonably burdened with the stress of realizing the ministry's new initiative.

Hopefully, you can put all of that out of your mind and enjoy the upcoming well-earned break. Over the summer, enjoy travelling, spending time outdoors, visiting with friends and family, reading those books you've had on your list, and generally, engaging in activities that will recharge you.
